Among the numerous factors influencing language learning success, motivation is widely recognized as one of the most critical elements. It directly affects learners'



willingness to engage in the learning process, their level of effort, and their persistence when facing challenges. Motivation in language learning is generally categorized into two main types: intrinsic and extrinsic motivation. Intrinsic motivation refers to learning driven by personal interest, enjoyment, or a desire for self-improvement, whereas extrinsic motivation is influenced by external factors such as grades, rewards, or social expectations. Both types play significant roles in shaping learners' attitudes and behaviors, yet their impact on language acquisition may differ depending on the learning context.

Previous studies have shown that highly motivated learners tend to demonstrate better performance, greater engagement, and more consistent progress in mastering a foreign language. However, maintaining motivation over time remains a challenge, particularly in environments where English is not used in daily communication. This highlights the importance of understanding how motivation works and how it can be effectively supported in educational settings. Method

Results

Specifically, learners who reported enjoying the learning process and having personal goals related to English proficiency scored higher on performance measures. In contrast, extrinsic motivation, such as studying for grades or external rewards, was found to have a more limited and short-term effect. While extrinsically motivated students did show effort in completing assignments, their level of engagement was generally lower, and their persistence decreased when external incentives were removed. However, a combination of both intrinsic and extrinsic motivation appeared to produce more balanced and sustainable learning outcomes.

Qualitative findings from interviews supported these results. Many students expressed that interactive teaching methods, such as group discussions, games, and real-life communication tasks, increased their interest and motivation. Classroom observations further confirmed that teachers who used diverse and student-centered strategies were more successful in maintaining learners' attention and participation. Additionally, the study found that a positive classroom environment significantly contributed to student motivation. Factors such as teacher support, constructive feedback, and a non-threatening atmosphere encouraged students to actively participate and take risks in using the language. Overall, the results indicate that motivation is a key determinant of learners' engagement, persistence, and achievement in English language learning.

Discussion

The results of this study highlight the crucial role of motivation in the process of learning English as a foreign language. Consistent with previous research, intrinsic motivation was found to have a stronger and more lasting impact on students' performance compared to extrinsic motivation. Learners who are internally driven tend to show greater interest, autonomy, and resilience, which are essential for long-term language acquisition. The findings also suggest that while extrinsic motivation can initiate learning behavior, it is not sufficient to sustain it over time. This indicates the need for educators to focus on developing students' intrinsic interest in learning English rather than relying solely on external rewards or pressures. One effective way to achieve this is by incorporating meaningful and engaging activities that relate to students' real-life experiences and goals.

Furthermore, the study emphasizes the significant role of teachers in shaping students' motivation. Teachers who create a supportive and interactive classroom environment can positively influence learners' attitudes and willingness to participate. Strategies such as collaborative learning, personalized feedback, and the use of authentic materials were found to be particularly effective in enhancing motivation. However, this study has some limitations. The use of convenience sampling may limit the generalizability of the findings, and the reliance on self-reported data could introduce bias. Future research could expand the sample size and include longitudinal studies to better understand how motivation evolves over time.

In conclusion, fostering strong motivation, particularly intrinsic motivation, is essential for improving English language learning outcomes. Teachers play a central role in this process by adopting effective teaching strategies and creating an encouraging learning environment
